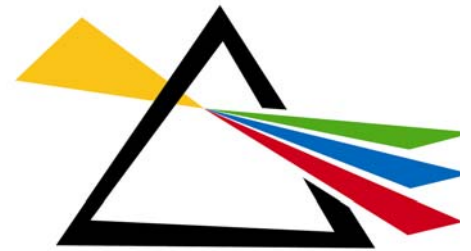

General Admission (Saturday, February 5th 9:00 a.m. to midnight) If you do not wish to purchase the super Melt-Down ticket, you can purchase a general admission ticket for \$5.00 per person in advance and \$7.00 at the door.

Investing In Our Children...

For over 150 years, the Waterloo Catholic District School Board has been serving the educational needs of the Region of Waterloo. The Waterloo Region Catholic Schools Foundation was created to *bridge the gap* between the government funding formula and the current fiscal realities faced by our 55 schools. Some of these realities are:

- Musical instruments are not available for elementary school students;
- Current science and technology equipment (i.e. microscopes, tools, computer assisted drafting software) is not adequately available to help students meet the curriculum expectations;
- Uniforms for student athletes are not available for each team member;
- Faith programs are not funded by the provincial government;
- Inequity of opportunity for all students to realize their unique potential.

The following Bursary and Endowment Funds have been established:

- Mirko Hroch "Quiet Leader" Memorial Scholarship;
- John Sweeney Memorial Scholarship;
- St. Jerome's High School Memorial Trust Fund.
